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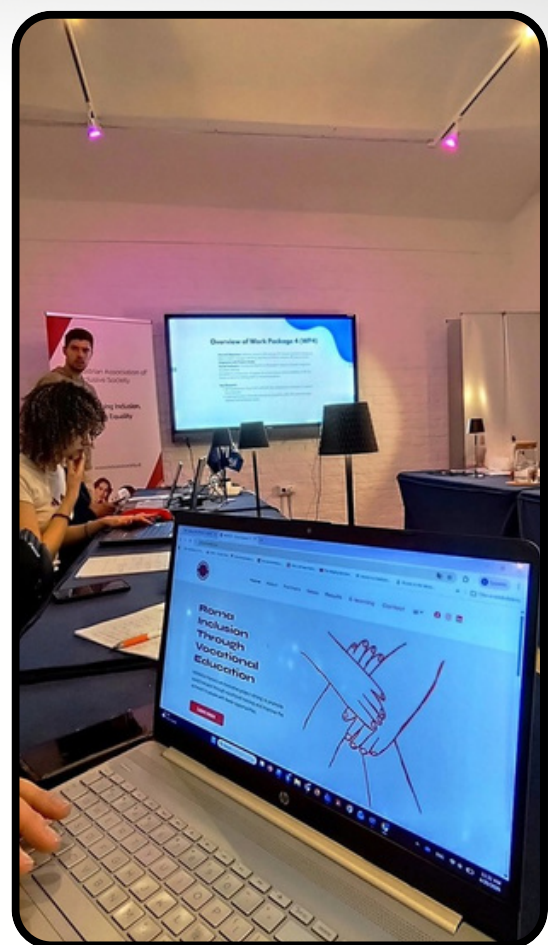
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LTТА IN VIENNA, AUSTRIA

IRMI as a project coordinator of Erasmus+ MIRANDA VET project, together with Consortium Partners from Germany, Greece, Austria, Bulgaria, and North Macedonia, met in Vienna for a 5-day (20-24 April 2026) LTТА training for collaborative learning and exchange.

Activities that took place during the LTТА training were mostly focused on enhancing trainers' and staff inclusion skills, complemented by visits to VET schools in Vienna. The program concluded with knowledge-sharing sessions and certification, reinforcing the consortium's commitment to building inclusive vocational pathways for Roma learners.

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DIGITAL COMICS IN GERMAN CLASSROOMS



As part of the DICOMI project, IRMI successfully organized and implemented a workshop in local schools in Germany. During the sessions, children were introduced to the concept of digital comics, exploring migration through storytelling and how can technology merge creatively. 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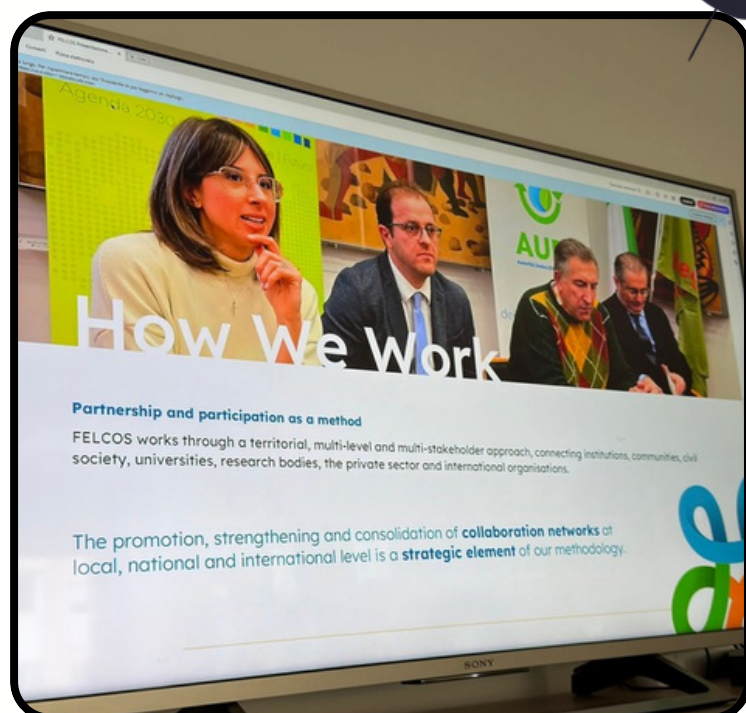
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KICK-OFF MEETING IN INNSBRUCK, AUSTRIA

one of the themes of the meeting was the exploration of irregular migration push and pull factors. Partners emphasized the importance of identifying, mapping, and understanding the drivers behind migration flows, including economic, social, and political influences. These discussions laid the groundwork for comprehensive research and practical implementation, ensuring that the project develops evidence-based strategies to contribute to safer futures for migrants and host communities alike.
